



## Short Biography - Pietari Inkinen, Conductor

The Finnish conductor Pietari Inkinen has worked with the world's leading orchestras, including the Cleveland Orchestra, Munich Philharmonic, BBC Symphony, Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra, La Scala Philharmonic, Accademia di Santa Cecilia, Orchestre Philharmonique de Radio France, Los Angeles Philharmonic, Israel Philharmonic, Bavarian Radio Symphony, Bamberg Symphony, and Oslo Philharmonic, as well as the Staatskapelle Dresden and the Leipzig Gewandhaus.

As an opera conductor, he is especially renowned for his Wagner interpretations, which brought him to head the production of *Der Ring des Nibelungen* in 2023 at the Bayreuth Festival. He was also awarded the Helpmann Award and the Green Room Award for his performances of the Ring Cycle at Opera Australia in 2014 and 2016. Other opera engagements have taken him to the Finnish National Opera, La Monnaie in Brussels, Teatro Massimo in Palermo, Staatsoper Unter den Linden in Berlin, Bayerische Staatsoper in Munich, and Semperoper Dresden.

Pietari Inkinen is the Chief Conductor of the Deutsche Radio Philharmonie Saarbrücken and Kaiserslautern and Music Director of the Korean KBS Symphony. Previously, he held chief positions with the Prague Symphony Orchestra, the Orchestra of the Ludwigsburg Festival, the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra, and the Japan Philharmonic Orchestra. An accomplished violinist, he studied at the Cologne Music Academy with Zakhar Bron before continuing his studies in conducting at the Sibelius Academy in Helsinki.
